

INTRODUCTION

Sree Narayana College, Cherthala was established by Sree Narayana Trusts, Kollam with the objective of providing higher education to the young men and women, especially of the backward communities of the locality. It is situated by the western side of NH-47, 7.5 km from Cherthala and 14.5 km from Alappuzha. The College lays special emphasis on character building and social commitments based on the teachings of Sree Narayana Guru who believed that “educated youth could shed the shackles of social discrimination and face the challenges of life with confidence and pride”. The SNDP Union, Cherthala extended its unreserved co-operation to the SN Trusts to start a College in the name of the Guru. Realizing the dreams of the Guru and materializing his exhortations like “Educate that you may be free” and “Enlightenment through Education” the College was inaugurated on 14th July 1964 by late Sri. R. Sankar, the founder Secretary of SN Trusts and the Chief Minister of Kerala.

From its humble beginning as a junior College, it has now attained the status of a senior College offering instruction in 12 Under Graduate courses and 6 Post Graduate courses. The College has more than 60 years of academic excellence. The College is affiliated to the University of Kerala and is recognized by the UGC.

II. DEGREE PROGRAMME (FDP) STRUCTURE

The First Degree Programmes include (1) Language Courses, (2) Foundation Courses, (3) Core Courses in the Major Subjects related to Degree Programmes, (4) Complementary Courses on allied Subjects, (5) Open Course, (6) Elective Courses and (7) Project/Dissertation. In the case of Career Related First Degree programmes under CBCSS, there shall be a component of Vocational Course.

1. Semester

Semester means a term consisting of 90 working days distributed over a minimum period of 18 weeks.

2. Course

Course means a portion of a subject to be taught and evaluated in a semester. A Course of 4 credits will meet a minimum of 4 hours per week and treated as full Course. A Semi-course of one credit will meet atleast one hour per week in a semester.

3. Language Courses

Language Courses are courses in English and an Additional Language of students' choice. Students who join for any B.A./B.Sc programme in this college have to study 6 Courses in English and 4 Courses in Additional Language. The Additional Languages offered are Malayalam, Hindi and Sanskrit. Those who join for B.Com programme have to study 4 Courses in English and 2 Courses in Additional Language.

4. Foundation Courses

Students who join for B.A./B.Sc. programmes have to study one course under Language and one course under Core. B.Com programme students have to take up both the Foundation Courses under the Core subject.

5. Core Courses

Core Course means compulsory course in a main subject related to the First Degree Programme (FDP) in a discipline. Students who join for B.A./B.Sc. programmes have to study compulsory 12-15 Core Courses and submit one Dissertation/Project report. For B.Com Programme a student has to attempt 16 Core Courses and submit one Dissertation/Project work.



6. Complementary Courses

Complementary Course means a course in a subject other than the major subject and is complementary to the main subject. Students who join for B.A./B.Sc. programmes have to study 8 to 10 Complementary courses while for B.Com programme a student has to choose 4 Complementary courses.

7. Open/Elective Course

Students who join for B.A./B.Sc. programmes have to study two courses to a minimum of 4 credits and for B.Com Degree programme a student has to study 6 courses to a minimum of 20 credits. Open Course means an optional course which the student is free to take at his/her will. Open Course shall be a course offered by the Departments other than the parent Department. Elective course means a specialized course from the frontier area of core subject.

Examination for Open Courses must be scheduled by the University and are to be conducted by Colleges strictly adhering to the schedule. The Question Papers are to be prepared by the Colleges and after the conduct of the examination, attendance statement along with two copies of Question Papers should be forwarded to the University. Evaluation is to be done by the respective Colleges. The students should write the examination in University answer book supplied by the University and the same will be distributed for evaluation among the teachers of respective Colleges. The valued answer scripts are to be kept in the respective Departments for 2 years. After valuation, the mark list must be send to the University within 20 days from the date of conduct of examination. Online submission must also be done at the appropriate time.

8. Audit Courses

Courses which student can register without earning credits (Zero Credit Course) and are not compulsory for completing the Degree Programme. Courses for more than the stated number of credits (120) may be obtained through Audit Courses.

9. Repeat Course

Repeat Course is a course that a student repeats if he/she has failed in it. Repeat courses are possible with the next batch for failed candidates. Students who complete the semester, by securing the minimum required attendance and by registering for ESE of each semester alone shall be promoted to higher semester. Students who fail to secure minimum required aggregate attendance during a semester shall be given



one or more chances to repeat the semester along with the subsequent batch of students after obtaining re-admission subjected to the condition that the candidate has to complete the programme in not more than 12 continuous semesters and that the candidate has to appear for CE afresh each time.

10. Credit

Credit of a course is a measure of the weekly unit of work involving lecture or laboratory session or seminar or similar activity designed for the course. Each credit hour is roughly equivalent to one hour of class time per week in a semester.

11. Attendance

Students who secure a minimum of 75% attendance in the aggregate for all the Courses of a semester taken together alone will be allowed to register for End Semester Evaluation (ESE). Others have to repeat the semester along with the next batch, unless they could make up the shortage of attendance through condonation. However, the award of Grade for attendance in CE shall be made course-wise. Condonation of shortage of attendance to a maximum of 10 days in a semester subject to a maximum of two times during the whole period of a Degree Programme shall be granted by the University on valid grounds. Benefits of attendance for a maximum of 10 days in a semester shall be granted to students who attend to University Union activities, meetings of University bodies and participation in extra curricular activities by treating as present for the days of their absence for the above purpose on production of participation/attendance certificate in such activities issued by the University Authorities/Principal.

12. Social Service/Extension Activities

Social Services and Extension activities are mandatory for all students in the 3rd & 4th semester with a minimum attendance of 40 hours. A Student who makes achievement in Sports/Arts/NCC/NSS shall get Grace Grade. The College offers the following Social Services and Extension Activities/Clubs.

1. National Cadet Corps (NCC), 2. National Service Scheme (NSS), 3. Nature Club/ Eco Club, 4. Sports Club, 5. Health Education, 6. Womens' Study Unit, 7. Debate Club, 8. Literary Club, 9. Media Club, 10. Science Club, 11. Planning Forum, 12. Anti-Ragging Cell, 13. Environmental Activities (Biodiversity Club).

13. Evaluation

The Evaluation of each Course shall consist of two parts :



1) Continuous Evaluation (CE)

2) End Semester Evaluation (ESE)

The CE and ESE ratio shall be 1:4 for both Courses with or without practical. There shall be a maximum of 80 marks for ESE and maximum of 20 marks for CE.

1) Continuous Evaluation (CE)

The marks of CE shall be consolidated by adding the marks of Attendance, Assignment/Seminar and Test Paper respectively for a particular Course.

a) Assignment/Seminar 10 marks

b) Test Paper 10 marks

Assignment or Seminar (Max. marks 10)

Each student shall be required to do one assignment or one seminar for each Course. Valued assignments shall be returned to the students. The seminars shall be organized by the teacher/teachers in charge of CE and the same shall be assessed by a group of teachers including the teacher/teachers in charge of that Course. Assignments/Seminars shall be evaluated on the basis of their quality. The seminar shall be similarly evaluated in terms of content, presentation, interaction etc.

Test Paper (Max. marks 10)

For each Course there shall be one Class Test during a semester. Valued answer scripts shall be made available to the students for perusal within 10 working days from the date of the test.

End Semester Evaluation (ESE)

ESE of all Courses in all the semesters shall be conducted by the University. The results of the ESE shall be arranged to be published according to the Examination Calendar prescribed by the University Level Monitoring Committee (ULMC), which shall not exceed 45 days from the last day of the examination. The maximum mark for a Course (ESE Theory) is 80. The duration of ESE is 3 hours. Total marks for the ESE of Practical is 80. The components of ESE of Practical have to be set by the Chairman, Board of Studies concerned. The marks for the components of Practical for Continuous Evaluation shall be as shown below.

a) Attendance 5 marks

b) Record 5 marks

c) Test 5 marks

d) Performance, Punctuality and Skill 5 marks



The marks of a Course are consolidated by combining the marks of ESE and CE (80+20).

A minimum of 40% marks (E Grade) is required for passing a Course with a separate minimum of 40% (E Grade) for CE & ESE.

14. Project/Dissertation Work

For each First Degree Programme there shall be a Project/Dissertation Work. The Project/Dissertation work can be done either individually or by a group not exceeding five students. However, Viva-Voce based on the Project/Dissertation work shall be conducted individually. The topics shall either be allotted by the supervising teacher or be selected by the students in consultation with the supervising teacher. The report of the Project/Dissertation shall be submitted to the Department in duplicate before the completion of the Sixth semester. There shall be no continuous assessment for Project/Dissertation work. A Board of two Examiners appointed by the University shall evaluate the report of the Project/Dissertation Work. The Detailed guidelines regarding the conduct and evaluation of the Project/Dissertation will be framed by the Board of Studies concerned.

15. Grading System

Grade indicates the level of performance of a student in a course. 'Grade Point' is an integer indicating the numerical equivalent of the broad level of performance of a student in a course. The product of Grade point and the credit of a course is called 'Credit Point' (CP).

16. Semester Credit Point Average (SCPA)

SCPA is an index of overall performance of a student at the end of a semester. It is obtained by dividing the sum of the Credit Points (CP) obtained by a student (multiply the Grade Point obtained by the student in each course by the Credit of that course) at the end of a semester by the sum of the credits of courses taken by the student in that semester. After the successful completion of a semester, Semester Credit Point Average (SCPA) of a student in that semester shall be calculated. Suppose the student has taken Four Courses each of 4 Credits and Two Courses each of 2 Credits in a particular semester, after consolidating the Grade for each Course, SCPA has to be calculated as shown in the example given below:

For the successful completion of a semester, a student has to score a minimum SCPA of 4.00 (E Grade). However, a student is permitted to move to the next semester irrespective of his/her SCPA.

17. Cumulative Credit Point Average (CCPA)

CCPA indicates the broad academic level of preformance of the student in a programme. It is obtained by dividing the sum of the credit points in all the courses taken by the student for the entire programme by the total number of credits.

For the successful completion of a Programme and award of the Degree, the student must pass all Courses satisfying the minimum Credit requirement of 120 and must score a minimum CCPA of 4.00 or an overall Grade of E.



18. Repetition of the Semester Courses

Students who fail to secure the minimum required aggregate attendance during a semester shall be given one chance to repeat the semester along with the subsequent batch of students after obtaining re-admission and they will have to repeat the CE for all Courses.

The normal duration of the First Degree Programme shall be Three years consisting of Six semesters. No students shall be allowed to complete the programme by attending more than 12 continuous semesters.

19. Re-appearance of Failed Students

Students who fail shall have to reappear for the ESE of the same along with the next regular batch of students. Candidates who fail to score 'E' Grade in the ESE in any of the Course/Courses have to reappear for the ESE of the Course/Courses concerned with next regular batch of students. The number of chances or such appearances is limited to 5 and the same have to be done within a period of 12 continuous semesters including the semester in which they have first appeared.

However, students who fail to secure SCPA of 4.00 have to reappear for the ESE with the next regular batch of students for such courses for which they have secured the least Grade for improving the SCPA. Here also the number of appearance is limited to 5 and the same has to be done within a period of 12 continuous semesters including the semester in which they have first appeared.

In both cases (i.e. failure to obtain 'E' Grade for individual Course/Courses and SCPA of 4.00) students shall not be allowed to repeat the semester, but the marks secured by them for the CE part shall be carried over and added to the marks obtained in the ESE they reappear. However, those who fail in the CE (i.e. those who fail to secure a minimum of 'E' Grade) will have one chance to improve the same (except the marks for attendance) along with next regular batch of students.

20. Improvement of ESE

Candidates who have successfully completed the semester, but wish to improve their marks for the ESE shall have only one chance for the same along with the next immediate regular batch of students. In this case, the better marks obtained shall be considered for the calculation of SCPA.



21. Grace Marks

Grace Marks shall be awarded for Sports/Arts/NCC/NSS in recognition of meritorious achievements.

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE COLLEGE

Morning Prayer and Class Hours

Classes begin in the morning at 9.45 am with the reverential rendering of the '*Daiva Dasakam*' (Prayer of Humanity), the song composed by **Sree Narayana Guru**. Staff and students stand up and observe silence during its soothing and melodious rendering, followed by National Anthem to evoke the spirit of patriotism.

Attendance

1. There are five working days in a week. The College works under the full day system with two sessions.
2. Every working day will have two sessions. The morning session is from 9.45 a.m. to 12.45 p.m. and the afternoon session is from 1.30 p.m. to 3.30 p.m. The morning session is divided into 3 periods and the afternoon session into 2 periods each of one hour duration. In between the two sessions there is a noon interval of 45 minutes from 12.45 pm to 1.30 pm. (College timing may change according to the rules of the Government)
3. Students should be in their seats right from the beginning of each class. They should not leave the class without the permission of the teacher. Latecomers shall not enter the class without the permission of the teacher. No student shall loiter on the campus or veranda during class hours.
4. Leave of absence for a period or portion may be obtained from the teacher concerned. Leave for a day or more shall be obtained in advance from the Principal by written application in the prescribed form. The Principal reserves the right to reject or grant leave.
5. A student absenting himself for a period of five continuous working days whether with or without leave application, should on his return report before the Principal.
6. Application for leave should be counter-signed by the Parent and recommended by the Tutor or the Teacher in-charge or the Head of the Department.
7. Unauthorised absence for 10 or more working days at a stretch is sufficient ground for the removal of the student from the rolls. Re-admission which is a discretion of the Principal, requires payment of a fee of Rs-50/- and any other fees due so far.
8. A minimum attendance of 75% of the total working days of the semester is required for promotion and for admission to University Examination. Shortage of



attendance for more than 20 days will be condoned by the Principal only if he is fully satisfied with the completion of all the formalities connected with it .

No application for exemption will be recommended by the Principal unless he is satisfied that the shortage of attendance was caused by reasons beyond the control of the student and that leave was duly applied for and was availed of during the period of absence.

9. Duty Leave for Physical Education activities will be granted only to athletes representing the College or University in various matches, tournaments and sports events. Such students should submit their leave applications duly recommended by the Director of Physical Education not later than one week after the event. The maximum period for which duty leave can be granted to a student for sports is 10% of the total number of working days.
10. There is no provision entitling the student to claim Duty Leave for College Union activities.

Admission and Withdrawal

1. Students are usually admitted only at the beginning of the first year of the Degree & Post Graduate Courses.
2. Candidates who have passed the +2 Course or an equivalent examination are eligible for admission to the Degree Course.
3. Candidates who have passed the respective Degree Examinations, namely B.A.(Economics), B.Sc.(Zoology), B.Sc.(Botany), B.Sc.(Physics) and B.Sc.(Computer Science) are eligible for admission to the Ist year M.A.(Economics), M.Sc.(Zoology), M.Sc.(Botany), M.Sc.(Physics) and M.Sc.(Computer Science) respectively. However 10% of the M.A.(Economics) seats are reserved for candidates who have passed the B.Sc.Mathematics Degree course.
4. The admission to the First Degree Programme under CBCS system in the Arts and Science Colleges affiliated to the University of Kerala and Centres of the University were made on the basis of Online Centralized Allotment. The Online allotment process will provide the candidates, opportunity of obtaining admission to any of the Colleges of the University/Centres and to any of the programmes of his/her choice on the basis of merit

Candidates possessing qualifying certificates from Universities or Board of Examinations other than those of Kerala University shall also produce.

- i) Migration Certificate



- ii) Qualifying Certificate
- iii) Eligibility Certificate from the University of Kerala.
- 5 No candidate shall be enrolled to attend any class until the prescribed fees is paid in full.
- 6. Any candidate who is found to have obtained admission by false representation will be summarily dismissed and will forfeit whatever fees he/she had paid.
- 7. A student applying for Transfer Certificate, Conduct Certificate etc. should do so in the prescribed form and should have paid all fees and dues if any. Transfer Certificate and Conduct Certificate will be normally issued free of charge within three months of the completion of a course of study at the College. Late applications for Transfer Certificate will have to be accompanied by a fine of Rs 50/- after one year.
A fee of Rs 100/- will be levied for issue of duplicate Transfer Certificate along with a bond in Stamp Paper worth Rs. 100/- However it will be issued only on the strength of a Certificate from a First Class Magistrate to the effect that the original has been lost irrecoverably.
- 8. Caution money will be refunded only at the end of a course, after clearing the dues if any.

Certificates

- 1. Generally three days notice is required for issue of any normal Certificate.
- 2. Certificates will be issued only after clearance of fees and dues, if any
- 3. Transfer Certificate and Conduct Certificate will be issued only at the end of the course.
- 4. All certificates will be issued only in the afternoon of regular working days.

PAYMENT OF FEES

Tuition fees will be collected in 3 termly installments. The first installment of fees including the special fees prescribed and Caution Deposit will be collected from the students of senior classes within a period of seven consecutive working days beginning from the date of re-opening of the college. In the case of students of junior classes the same will be collected on or before the 7th consecutive working day of the month concerned. The Principal is competent to fix the due date for collection of fees for the various classes.

Note:

- The fee rates shown above are tentative. If there is a revision, the balance will have to be paid.
- Tuition fee is to be paid in 3 termly installments and all other items of fees on enrolment.
- Students joining BA/B.Sc./B.Com. classes from other Universities shall pay the Matriculation fee of Rs. 50/- after admission and apply for recognition of the qualifying examination. They should produce eligibility certificate along with their application.
Students belonging to Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and other Eligible Communities are exempted from payment of fees. Those who belong to Other



Backward Communities are also eligible for fee concession, if they produce Income Certificate from the Village Officer together with a community certificate issued by the Thahasildar (income of family shall not exceed Rs. 25000/- for students of Degree classes and Rs.42000/- for PG).

Fee Concession

- i. Applicants belonging to the SC/ST/OEC, Kudumbis and Christian converts from Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes who are bonafide subjects of Kerala State are eligible for full concession, stipend and lumpsum grant for purchase of books and dress. They will have to produce a Certificate of Nativity and Certificate of Community at the time of admission if the community is not shown in the SSLC/SSC Book.
- ii. Applicants belonging to backward and forward communities who are bonafide subjects of the Kerala State are eligible for full fee concession, if the income of their families does not exceed Rs. 25000/- in the case of students of Degree Class and Rs. 42,000/- in the case of Post Graduate Class as per the Kumara Pillai Commission report. (No concession in respect of B.Sc Computer Science).
- iii. Exemption from payment of Tuition Fees is allowed to the Children/ Grand Children of "Political Sufferers" if the income does not exceed Rs.15,000/- per annum.

Note : Applicants eligible for fee concession will have to produce the following certificates at the time of admission.

- i. Applicants belonging to the SC/ST, Kudumbi and Christian converts from SC/ST should produce an Income Certificate and Community Certificate in original.
- ii. Applicants belonging to OBC must produce an Income Certificate (in the prescribed form issued by the Village Officer and counter signed by the Local Panchayat President/ Chairman of Municipality/Mayor of the Corporation/ Honorary Magistrate/ MLA or MP).
- iii. The income of both the parents must be shown in the form and Certificate of income of the Guardian will be accepted only in the case of orphans or in other exceptional cases.
- iv. Community and nativity certificates in the prescribed form have to be submitted within 15 days from the commencement of class, failing which, fee will have to be paid.
- v. Applicants who do not produce the necessary certificates at the time of admission will not be admitted unless they pay the prescribed fees.



- vi. In the case of applicants whose parents have died in harness while in State Government service, harness fees concession will be granted on production of necessary documents, provided the income of the guardian does not exceed Rs. 4000/- per annum.

Refund of Caution Deposit

1. Caution deposit levied will be refunded when the student completes his/her course of study, after deduction of dues if any. However in the case of student leaving the College with his/her TC before completion of the course of study, the caution deposit will be refunded, after deduction of dues if any.
2. Students must apply for their caution deposits in the prescribed form on the specified dates.
3. Students applying for caution deposits should produce the receipts issued for remittance of the deposit. Failure to do so will result in the forfeiture of the amount.
4. After the completion of a course, claim for refund of caution deposits should be made by the applicant before the re-opening of the College. If this is not done, the names of those who have not claimed the deposits will be published on the college notice board.

DRESS, BEHAVIOUR AND DISCIPLINE

1. Every student is expected to be decent, cultured, polished and pleasing in his words and deeds inside and outside the College premises.
2. Students are expected to be courteous in word and deed. They must greet their teachers respectfully when they meet them.
3. Students are required to be neat and tidy in dress and person.
4. Students should handle the College properties with care. They are expected to do whatever they can to protect and promote beauty, charm and dignity of the campus. Any damage done to the college property will have to be made good by the students themselves or else a fine will be levied from them.
5. Students should not write, carve, paint or do anything that will disfigure any part of the College building, walls, furniture, College premises including compound walls.
6. Students shall take their seat in the class room as soon the first bell is given. They shall rise when the teacher enters the class room and remain standing till he/she takes his/her seat and directs them to sit down. Students should keep with them the required text books or note book(s) for the classes they attend.



7. No student will be allowed to enter or leave the classroom when the session is going on without the permission of teacher.
8. Students shall not roam about on verandas, corridors or inside the campus during working hours or do anything which will cause disturbance to the classes during working hours.
9. No notice, petitions etc of any kind shall be circulated among students for publicity without the written permission of the Principal.
10. Students are strictly prohibited from holding meetings or functions of any kind or collecting any fund without the prior permission of the Principal.
11. Political activism is strictly banned on the campus. Students are forbidden to organize or attend meetings other than the official ones. Students who engage in any such activity which may cause disruption to classes or disturbance on the College campus are liable to be dismissed from the College.
12. Students shall not take active part in political agitations against the Government or Management.
13. Students on strike are strictly prohibited from entering the verandas /class rooms or shouting slogans inside the campus.
14. All strikes, demonstrations, agitations, dharnas, hartals and the like are banned on the College campus. Students who violate this rule shall be dismissed summarily.
15. Smoking, chewing, snuffing and other unwholesome practices are strictly prohibited on the campus/premises.
16. Irregular attendance, insubordination to teachers and staff, indifference in class, habitual mischief-making, obscenity in deeds or words are sufficient reasons for suspension or dismissal of a student from the College.
17. Minor offenses are punishable with fine.
18. Malpractices in University Examinations and other examinations will be severely dealt with.
19. Any genuine grievance of students may be brought to the notice of the Principal through the group tutor or through the Grievance Redressal Cell.
20. The Principal is the final authority in the interpretation of the College bylaws and he reserves the right to frame and enforce rules governing the conduct of students in the class rooms and on the College campus.
21. All students admitted to the College should keep their Identity Cards issued by the College authority. The students should produce their Identity Cards when the teaching/administrative or other staff members demand it.



22. Mobile phones are strictly banned for students on the College campus. Any student who violates this rule will be fined a sum of Rs. 500/- and the amount should be paid to the account of KRIPA.

Medical Inspection

1. Every student of the College shall submit a Certificate of Medical Inspection or a Health Card from the institution last attended.
2. Those students who fail to report for Medical inspection are liable for punishment by the Syndicate on the report of the Principal.

Physical Training

Facilities are provided for sports, games and gymnastics, Students are expected to make good use of them.

College Examinations

1. All classes will have two internal examinations in each semester, the marks of which will be added for internal evaluation of the student.
2. In addition to these general examinations special test papers will be given from time to time at the discretion of the Head of the Department or the teachers concerned. Test papers will be evaluated and the records will be kept in the departments concerned. Progress cards will be sent to the Guardians.
3. Exemption from attending the College Examinations is granted only by the Principal.

Tutorial Supervision

Tutorial system is in force in the College. Each member of the staff will act as a group tutor of 25-40 students of a class. The tutor keeps himself in touch with the students and ensures their progress in studies and participation in curricular, co-curricular and extra curricular activities. It helps to strengthen the relationship between teachers and students. The counselling and persuasive approach of teachers will help in moulding the character and personality of the student. The Tutor will watch over the ward's progress and conduct and give him/her general advice in his studies. Leave will be granted and Conduct Certificates will be issued to students only on the recommendation of the Group Tutor. The Group Tutor is expected to establish parental contact with his/her wards.

Residence of Students

Students who do not live with their parents or guardians should reside only in hostels and lodges approved by the Principal.



FACILITIES IN THE COLLEGE

1. College Library and General Rules

1. All students of the college shall become members of the Library.
2. The Library has three main sections
 - a) Reading and Reference Sections
 - b) General Section (GS)
 - c) Departmental Section (DS)
- a) Reading and Reference Section
 1. The Reading and Reference Section is to be made use of by the students during working hours. The reference books will not be issued to the students to be taken home instead it can only be used as reference in the library.
 2. Students shall produce their identity cards for entry into the library.
 3. It will remain open on all working days from 9 a.m. till 5 p.m.
 4. Books, magazines, news papers etc. belonging to this section shall not be taken out.
 5. Students are expected to be in this section of the library during free hours.
 6. Students shall handle books, periodicals and news papers with utmost care and place them intact before leaving the library.
 7. Students are expected to be co-operative in keeping the library neat, tidy and in order.
- b) General Section
 8. Book will be issued only on production of identity cards. Loss of identity cards must be promptly reported to the Librarian. A new card will be issued on payment of Rs. 1/-
 9. A student is permitted to borrow only two books at a time. These volumes however, shall not belong to the same section.
 10. Books taken out by students shall not be retained for more than 7 days. Failure to return a book on the due date entails a fine of Rs 1 per day per volume.
 11. Books taken for a vacation shall be renewed after one week.
 12. A student against whom any fine or other charge is outstanding will not be issued books from the General or Departmental Library. Further he/she will not be allowed to attend classes if the dues are not cleared within a month.



13. Transfer or sub- lending of books is strictly prohibited.
14. Marking, underlining etc., in any book or magazine is forbidden.
15. Books borrowed from the library shall be returned forthwith if the Librarian directs so.
16. Students shall bring to the notice of the Librarian damage if any, in a book while borrowing failing which they will be held responsible for such damage.
17. Compensation for books lost, damaged or defaced shall be paid by the borrower as estimated by the Librarian.
18. Prescribed text books will not be issued to the students.
19. Students shall return their library cards at the end of their course.

c) **Departmental Section**

Students can refer as well as borrow books from the Departmental Section as per the discretion of the Librarian.

2. Auditorium

The College has a spacious auditorium where College assemblies, meetings, seminars and variety entertainments are conducted. It is also put into use as an Indoor Shuttle Badminton court.

3. Canteen

Tea, Snacks or Lunch will be provided at subsidised rates for the students in the College Canteen.

4. Counselling Room

Personal counselling is given to the students and outsiders with psychological problems. A separate cabin for this is provided in the Department of Philosophy.

5. Digital Conference Hall

LCD multimedia projector and arrangements for Power Point presentations are available in the air-conditioned Digital Conference Hall which are made use of by various Departments.

6. First-Aid Cell

The cell working under the NSS offers first-aid service to the students and public.

7. FIST Laboratory

The College has a FIST Laboratory established under the FIST Scheme.



8. Guruvaram Seminar Hall

Digitalised air conditioned Seminar Hall was donated by Teachers and Students.

9. Gymnasium

The College has an equipped Gymnasium Hall meant for the benefit of the staff and students.

10. Internet Club and Common Computer lab

Three Computer Labs with Internet facility are utilized in the College for various classes, programmes and the activities of the Internet Club.

11. Ladies Hostel

The Sree Narayana College has a Girls hostel “Sisiram”. The hostel is located in the College campus. The Principal is the Chief Warden of the hostel. The hostel has a Deputy Warden from the teaching faculty of the College who is responsible for the discipline, maintenance of the buildings, allotment of room and any other duty assigned by the Chief Warden from time to time. The hostel also has a resident Tutor from the teaching faculty to look after the immediate needs of the inmates and to assist the Deputy Warden. All girl students who do not stay with their parents shall be permitted to stay only in the College Hostel.

12. Meditation Corner

A Meditation Corner in the Department of Philosophy is open to students and staff throughout the day on all working days.

13. Research Facility

Department of Zoology offers fulltime and part time research facility.

14. Seminar Hall

It is made use of by various Departments for meetings and seminar presentations. General staff meetings are also held regularly at this venue.

15. Sree Narayana College Co-operative Society Ltd. No. A-394 A

A Co-operative Society functions in the College to supply the needs of the students and staff regarding text books, stationery articles, laboratory records, exercise books etc. Prescribed applications forms for Leave, conduct Certificate and Caution Deposit are also available at the College Co-operative Store.

Members of staff are share - holders of the society and students are associate members. On admission to the College every student shall pay Rs. 5/- as fee for Associate membership. The amount shall not be refunded.

16. Tissue Culture Lab

A well-equipped Tissue Culture Lab for academic purposes functions under the Department of Botany.

17. University Information Counter

The Counter is open to the students and the public during office hours.

18. Academic Spectrum

A Multidisciplinary Peer Reviewed Journal-ISSN-2456-3056

The Journal invites article and review from academics and researchers in disciplines of arts, science and commerce to be published in its issues. The Journal is a platform for the publication of discourses pertaining to researches in various disciplines. The articles are peer reviewed by committees of experts in the relevant domains. Members of faculty, Research Scholars, Post Graduate students and the like publish their works from time to time in this Journal, the ISSN version of which was launched in December 2014. In the preceeding years it had served as an in-house publication from 2008 onwards.

19. Legal Literacy Centre, SN College Unit

As per the direction of the Kerala State Legal Aid and Advisory Board, Legal literacy centre has been functioning in this college since 1987. The objective of this centre is to acquaint the student community with the basic and general laws of the country. Classes by legal experts are conducted for interested students on various legal subjects like Constitutional laws, Motor Vehicle Laws, Building laws, Prevention of damages to public property, Police Act, Consumer Protection laws, Laws relating to Drugs etc.

Sri. Sarun Kumar T.R., Assistant Professor, Dept. of Chemistry is the Programme Officer of this Centre.

20. National Cadet Corps (NCC)

National Cadet Corps is a premier youth organization of the country. The NCC is a unique organization that has a variety of activities that include institutional training, community development, adventure, sports and youth exchange programmes. It instills in the cadets a sense of discipline, social service, esprit-de-corps and co-operation besides developing their latent qualities of leadership, spirit of adventure, environmental awareness and adaptability.

Both girls and boys subunits of NCC Army Wing and Naval Wing have been functioning in the College. The cadets undergo institutional training of four hours duration per week and the cadets should attend the centralized camps like



Annual Training Camp, National Integration Camp etc. of 12 days duration. Cadets who have the required attendance to a their credit and have shown sufficient progress can appear for B and C Certificate examination conducted by Ministry of Defence.

Incentives of NCC

The NCC offers the cadet reservation and weightage of marks for admission to higher studies. The University of Kerala awards grace marks (maximum of 10%) to eligible cadets. The Central and State Governments provides various job incentives to NCC cadets. The NCC, B certificate and C certificate are valid and acceptable for entry to Armed Forces in various cadres including commissioned officers. Various scholarships are also granted to outstanding cadets.

21. National Service Scheme (NSS)

The National Service Scheme aims at education through community service. It is intended to rouse the social consciousness of the student community and mould them into useful citizens. The NSS unit of the College was selected as the best unit at the University level twice. Membership in NSS is voluntary. There are 2 units in the college. Each unit has a strength of 100 students. Volunteers who complete 240 hours of work in two years and attend one special camp of 7 days duration during the above period are eligible for a certificate issued by the University. Grace marks are awarded for such students in the CBCSS exam while assessing the final grade of students.

Membership in NSS and a certificate from the University will be treated as additional qualification while making recruitments to public services.

EXTENSION ACTIVITIES

1. Additional Skill Acquisition Programme (ASAP)

Skill development is one of the driving courses for economic growth and social development. Additional Skill Acquisition Programme (ASAP) is jointly implemented by the Higher Education Department, Government of Kerala, and focuses on equipping students with additional skills for employability. It imparts additional skill modules along with the regular educational process for Under Graduate students. The project provides an additional module of skill enhancement of 300-350 hours per year, for college going students who opt for the course. A student who completes level 0-1 module of 300-350 hours would be evaluated and provided with a Skill Certificate issued jointly by the concerned industry in association with the government. Development of curriculum, training methodologies and internships for the advanced skill module courses are carried out by an industry expert.

SCHOLARSHIPS

1. **National Loan Scholarship**

Given to the Indian Nationals for all courses after matriculation or SSLC leading to Degree, Post Graduate and Post M.A./M.Sc. Stages. Those who gain 50% aggregate marks in SSLC or +2 Examination in the first attempt are eligible. Income limit is Rs. 25,000/- for Under Graduates. For others there is no income limit. Students who get Scholarship/Stipend under any other scheme are not eligible.

2. **Kerala University Merit Scholarship for the Three Year B.A./B.Sc. Course**

Not less than 950 marks in the +2 Examination in the first attempt is required. Scholarship amount is Rs 900/- per annum.

3. **Govt. of India National Merit Scholarship**

First class in the qualifying examination. Those who top the merit list within the quota allotted to the State will be eligible, subject to certain conditions. Those who have passed the qualifying examination in the year prior to the year of award will be eligible. Students enjoying any other scholarship or stipend will not be considered for the award but they can enjoy fee concession.

4. **Merit Scholarship for the children of School Teachers**

Children of Primary and Secondary School teachers alone are eligible. Students enjoying any other scholarship will not be considered. Income of parents should not exceed Rs. 6,000/-per annum.

5. **Govt. of India Scholarship to the Physically Handicapped students**

Candidates should submit their applications in the prescribed forms along with the required documents such as Medical Certificate, Income Certificate etc. to prove age and educational qualification. Photograph is necessary in the case of orthopaedically handicapped applicants.

6. **Award of Financial aid from the Student's Aid Fund under UGC Scheme**

The University maintains Student's Aid Fund with the grant obtained from the University Grants Commission and the collections made from the students of the affiliated Colleges. Final Year students of the Degree class who have obtained more than 50% marks in the qualifying examinations are eligible to apply for the aid. The Annual income of their parents/guardian should not exceed Rs. 3,000 and they should not be enjoying fee concession or getting financial aid from any other source. The aid will be sanctioned by the University.



Students enjoying other Scholarship or stipend will not be considered for the award though they can enjoy fee concession.

7. Educational concession to the Children and Grand Children of Political Sufferers

Children of freedom fighters whose annual income does not exceed Rs.3,600/- are eligible. In the case of INA Personal, the Certificate issued by the All India. INA Relief and Enquiry Committee, New Delhi may be obtained and submitted with the application, either in original or copy attested by the District Collector or Revenue Divisional Officer instead of the certificates mentioned in the column No. 9 of the Application Form.

8. Fisheries Scholarship from the Director of Fisheries Thiruvananthapuram

Students of all classes belonging to fisherman community are eligible. The prescribed application form and rules can be had from the Officer of the Regional Deputy Director of Fisheries, Alappuzha- Award amount for Degree is Rs. 400/- per annum.

9. Kerala State Higher Education Council Scholarship

First year Under Graduate & Post Graduate students, who have secured 55% marks in qualifying examination in previous year can apply on-line ([http:// dcescholarship. kerala.gov.in/hecscholarship/main](http://dcescholarship.kerala.gov.in/hecscholarship/main)). The scholarships will be given on the basis of annual income. Scholarship amount for Post Graduate students is Rs. 40,000/- in 1st year and 60,000/- in 2nd year.

10. Directorate of Collegiate Education (DCE) Scholarship

Notifications and guidelines are available at [http:// dcescholarship. kerala.gov.in](http://dcescholarship.kerala.gov.in). Registration of all scholarship applications are through on-line. All scholarships are renewed in subsequent years.

11. Post Metric Scholarship

First year Under Graduate & Post Graduate students, who have secured 55% marks in qualifying examination in previous year can apply. Candidates should belong to minority community and the annual income of their parents should not exceed Rs.2 lakhs. Scholarship amount for the Graduate & Post Graduate students is Rs.3,000/- per year.

12. State Merit Scholarship

First year Under Graduate & Post Graduate students can apply. The annual income of their parents should not exceed Rs. 1 lakh. Scholarship amount for the Graduate students is Rs.1,500/- per year.



13. Muslim Girls Scholarship

First year Under Graduate & Post Graduate students, who have secured 55% marks in qualifying examination in previous year can apply. Girl candidates should belong to Muslim, Latin catholic, converted Christian and annual income of their parents should not exceed Rs.4.5 lakhs. Scholarship amount for a Graduate student is Rs.4,000/- per year and Post Graduate student is Rs.12,000/- per year (incl. Hostel fee).

14. Central Sector Scholarship

First year Under Graduate & Post Graduate students who have secured 80% marks in qualifying examination can apply. The annual income of their parents should not exceed Rs.6 lakhs. Scholarship amount of Graduate students is Rs.20,000/- per year.

15. Suvarna Jubilee Merit Scholarship

First year Under Graduate & Post Graduate students, who have secured 55% marks in qualifying examination in previous year can apply. Candidates should belong to BPL family and annual income of their parents should not exceed Rs.1 lakh. Scholarship amount for the Graduate students is Rs.10,000/- per year.

16. Hindi Scholarship (HS)

First year Under Graduate & Post Graduate students who has Hindi as one of the subject in the present course. There is no income limit. Candidates who have scored 60% marks in Hindi examination in the qualifying exam in the previous year can also apply.

17. Muslim Nadar Girls Scholarship (MNS)

First year Under Graduate students who have secured 60% marks in the qualifying examination can apply. Candidates should belong to BPL family and backward community family income should not exceed Rs.18,000/-

18. Blind/Physically Handicapped Scholarship (BPHS)

First year Under Graduate & Post Graduate students can apply. Fee concession is their for blind students with family income below Rs.2.5 lakhs. Hostel charges are provided or all differently abled students who are hostellers, and whose family income is below Rs. 4.5 lakhs.

19. Post Graduate Indira Gandhi Scholarship for Single Girl Child

Any single girl child, the only child of her parents, who is doing first year Post Graduate course can apply.



20. Kerala State Welfare Corporation for forward Communities Merit Scholarship

First year Post Graduate & Under Graduate students who have scored 70% in +2 examination in the first attempt can apply. Candidates should belong to forward community but should be economically backward.

21. Kerala State Council for Science & Technology & Environment (KSCTE) Prathibha Scholarship

First year B.A/B.Sc.students who have scored 90% in +2 examination in the first attempt can apply.

PRIZES AND AWARDS

1. K.K. Velu Memorial Scholarship

This is instituted by M/s. Bharat Trusts, Kanichukulangara to perpetuate the memory of the Late K.K. Velu of Charangattu. The Scheme consists of 5 Scholarships of Rs.200/- each payable to 5 students of different disciplines on mean cum merit basis for each year of study in this College.

2. PTA Scholarship

The Parent Teacher Association awards Rs 500/- to Degree students and Rs 1,000/- to Post Graduate students who score highest marks in each subject. This came into effect in 2004 -2005. PTA awards are given to outstanding students in the field of sports, NCC and NSS.

3. V.MAnoop Memorial Award

The Award of Rs: 2000/- is given to the Student Securing Highest marks in B.Sc. Chemistry.

4. P.C Sasikumar Memorial Award

This award of Rs: 1000/- is given to the best student in Final BA Malayalam.

5. P.O Purushothaman Memorial Award

This award of Rs: 1500/- is given to the best student of Second Year BA Malayalam

6. O.S Sanjeev Memorial Award

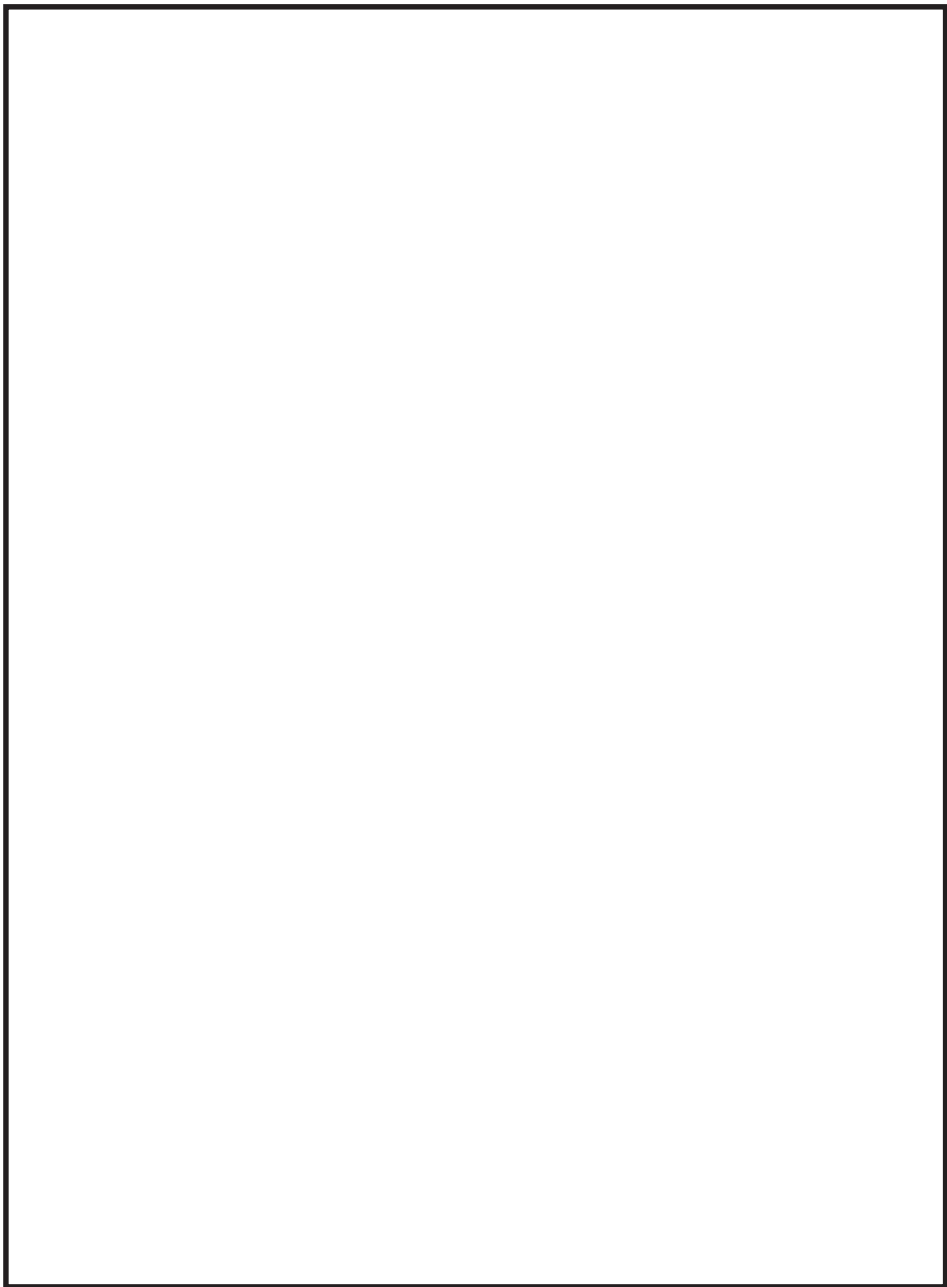
